# **BTC 2023 Specialty Conformation Results with Critiques**

### From our judge: Amanda

Thank you to the Border Terrier Canada club for inviting me to judge their 2023 National Specialty. The committee, members, and exhibitors made it a wonderful day. I was extra honoured to learn this was your largest entry to date.

Special thanks to Erin, Pearl, Pam, Bev, Marion & Mel, Casey, and Duane for their various contributions to this weekend.

As I mentioned at the banquet, the grass length in our ring left something to be desired, and I suspect some dogs would do better in shorter grass. The bites were good, except for one. Teeth size was at least sufficient on all entries, and a couple who really pleased me.

My final decisions were made on type and silhouette. I was always seeking and rewarding correct underlines, toplines maintained on the move, and well-balanced necks widening into correct shoulders. Similarly, muscular rears with well-bent stifles and correct set on of tail helped propel my winners to the top.

#### Dogs

#### Juvenile Male (1 entered, 1 shown)

**1st #612 Jansim Blue Collar Man** – owners: Elizabeth and Tony Hunt Blue and tan, up to size, not in his best jacket. Typical head. Entered in the appropriate class as still looking young.

#### Canadian Bred Male (1 entered, 1 shown)

**1st #613 Versaterre's March of Johnny Rose** – owners: Megan Crane and Cynthia Bernier Balanced entry. He was not impressed with the grass length but did well despite it. Sufficient coat to determine correct. Lovely teeth. On to *Winners Dog/Best of Winners*. In the Winners class, he was the most complete package.

#### Bred By Exhibitor Male (1 entered, 1 shown)

**1st #624 Rivermerre's You Can't Take It With You** – owner: Mary Cole Many of the traits I liked in the WD are also found in this dog. Onto **Reserve Winners Dog**, bowing to WD today on flexibility. His movement took him above the other entries to the Reserve spot.

#### Open Male (2 entered, 1 move up, 1 shown)

**1st # 625 Castle Guard Perfect Optimism** – owner: Megan Rai Ferguson Up to size, but not in his best jacket. Typical head and expression.

## Veteran 7 to 10-year-old Male (2 entered, 1 shown, 1 absent)

**1st # 626 CH Otley's When Lightening Strikes** – owner: Beverley Embley My notes say "makes me happy!" This boy was in coat, quality head, lovely hide, and could still go out and move correctly. In Best of Breed lineup, ended up with an **Award of Merit**.

## Veteran over 12-year-old Male (1 entered, 1 shown)

1st #627 Cherubkin Arundel CGN – owner: Megan Rai Ferguson

You would not know this boy was over 12 years old. There was not only a joie de vivre about his attitude, but he could still move correctly. Coat and hide had all of what I was looking for. Slightly less flexible than ideal but he's over 12 years old, so really not unexpected, I have a big :-) in my notes for this boy, and he held up in Best of Breed and went on to **First Award of Merit and Best Veteran**.

## Bitches

### Junior Puppy (1 entered, 1 shown)

1st # 615 Glebeheath Olivia – owner: Debbie Miyashita

A blue and tan in a lovely deep coat, a very promising puppy. She was not impressed by the grass and it reflected slightly in her movement. Sent her on to **Best Puppy**.

### Juvenile Female (3 entered, 3 shown)

1st #617 Glenbarr Miss Money Penny – owner: Joe Bryan

2nd #628 Oreos Casablanca PSI Mysteria – owner: Brigitta Waller First place bitch over the second on movement, including top line and tail set. Second held her own above the third-place bitch in movement, which may have been influenced by the grass length. First went on to **Winners Bitch**, taking that award on her silhouette and movement.

#### Canadian Bred Female (1 entered, 1 shown)

**1st #629 Irish Lilt's Dreamfyre** – owner: Megan Rai Ferguson Blue and tan bitch, not in her best jacket. Did not appreciate the grass length either.

### Bred By Exhibitor Female (1 entered, 1 shown)

**1st #630 Playmoor It Has To Be Shasta** – owner: Richard, Terry and Rebecca Richey Another blue and tan girl, typical coat and hide.

### Open Female (6 entered, 1 move up, 1 absent)

1st #634 Castle Guard Tanqueray's Neq Flor De Seville – owner: Laura Jackman 2nd #633 Zealous Autumn's Spring Fling – owner: Beverley Embley First-place bitch was not doing much to help herself, but when she decided to move, her silhouette and movement were enough to carry her to the front of the line. Second over the rest of the class on silhouette. First went on to **Reserve Winners Bitch** again on her movement.

## Veteran 7 to 10-year-old Female (1 entered, 1 shown)

**1st #637 Astra Anarchia PSY Mysteria** – owner: Megan Rai Ferguson Not a lot of coat, but what she had was enough to show it is correct, and a hide to really appreciate. Kept her in my final cuts in Best of Breed, and she deserved to be there. **Best of Opposite Sex to Best Veteran** 

#### Field Female (1 entered, 1 shown)

1st #622 AGMCH RCH Zealous Goelitz Mini JellyBean RM RMX ME VG TDGCH RATN SDN JT NP AGX AGXJ MADC MJDC MSDC MSCDC MGDC – owner: Nancy Lee

Another blue and tan, moved well but did not appreciate the grass, good coat and hide. Typical head. **Best Working**.

Best Of Breed

11 dogs with the move-up, 13 bitches with the move-up.

I made an initial cut in dogs and bitches, and then reworked those entries along with my Non-Regular Classes Winners and Winners Dog and Bitch.

In full, correct coat with good hide. Once you got your hands into that coat, you could really appreciate both the coat and the body underneath. Maintained her top line in movement, which not all other entrants were able to do. Very pleased to award her **Best of Breed and Best Otter Head**.
